Kia ora,

Today is day 3 of the Level 3 Corvid 19 Lockdown and Trident is open for learning – in the school for those Year 9 and 10 students who are not able to stay at home, and in the virtual world where our students are engaging in a whole new way of working with teachers, devices, different digital platforms and becoming focussed on the ability to manage how, when and what they do with their learning. It has been transformative in our learning world. In this strange new world of learning from a small screen, Trident staff and students have been amazingly creative with the on-line course showing innovation, collaboration across subjects and communication through the many different platforms that are available. While this may be challenging, it is also very refreshing seeing how many of our students have risen to the challenge and are sharing, working, collaborating, asking and delivering work in the on-line environment. Some of our students are not able to access the on-line world and on Wednesday we posted out extra hard copies to support the MOE work that was delivered to students. Our staff have been developing courses that will allow the students to achieve, while in the bubble, and will be prepared for returning to school. At the moment, our teachers are looking at what returning to school will actually be like and how we will work alongside our students to reengage with the reality of being in an actual class and not the virtual class. We are also aware that the students may be concerned about being able to achieve NCEA levels if there is a reduction in the credits because of the reduced time at school. Our Heads of Department are planning to ensure that all of our courses will provide enough opportunity for our students to achieve their appropriate level.

- ✓ Our PE department has devised a Lockdown 5KM Challenge as part of the PE learning environment, to raise funds for the Salvation Army.

- ✓ Our Tech staff have been delivering portfolios to students to work on.
- ✓ In the art classes, Mr Barr painted a picture using food colouring, for students who were not able to access paints.
- ✓ Subjects have been devising activities, that take our students away from the screen and focus on practical challenges - making music, creating website videos and completing activity challenges.

Our Prefects have been excellent in keeping the Social Media side of the school aware of the activities and the opportunities that can be achieved, even while in the bubble. The Trident Facebook shows the positive approach of many of our students to the current situation.

Our Senior Management Leadership team is planning the return to school and how it will look for our students when we move to Level 2. We are aware of the NCEA pressures on our senior students so we will be looking at ways that will enable our teachers and students to catch-up on their learning and ensure that that they are able to succeed in 2020. On that note we can celebrate the excellent overall results of our students in 2019 with our school producing the best results in the Eastern Bay and being in top three in Level 1 and 2 in the wider Bay and the top school in Level 3 amongst state co-ed schools in the Bay of Plenty. This shows that we have the background, teachers, students and traditions to support our students through this crisis. To do so we will need the support of our families and whanau. Next week we will be asking you to start thinking about your student's return to school when the country moves to Level 2. I will provide more information in due course.

Our key focus is the cooperation, collaboration and innovation in keeping the learning process fresh, engaging and supported through feedback and on-line advice and guidance.


