


Abel Tasman Camp

At Trident, we have many superstar students, but we also have many teachers who quietly achieve at high levels in their chosen profession.

We congratulate Mrs Sarah Shaw (top) and Mrs Tracey Webster (below) on their presentations at the Maths conference last week. Mrs Shaw presented in a very powerful way about our Financial Literacy Programme and Mrs Webster presented around innovative ideas within the Statistics Programme. By presenting at conferences, our teachers are modelling what one of our core values, kia manawa nui, looks like in action.





We congratulate and thank our Science teacher Miss Erin Nolan who recently ran a Professional Development day for BOP Earth and Space Science teachers where she was showing other teachers what we do in our Trident Year 13 programme. In the BOP Miss Nolan is one of a handful of Earth Science teachers with a background in Earth



Science. Trident is also one of few schools to run a practical for a practical investigation whereas most schools model situations.

The programme that Miss Nolan was sharing focusses on a local study of a past eruption out of Mt Tarawera which happened around 700 years ago. Students write a report on how geologists worked out the age of eruption and then go out and study the deposits for it. We went on a full day field trip and the other teachers loved what we do.

Miss Nolan says it "was really cool to share what we do and how we study an eruption that occurred around the time that Maori arrived in New Zealand".
